

## Fact Sheet

### Supporting Information

This fact sheet may assist you when writing your application for a Social Enterprise Grant. We suggest checking your draft application against the columns below.

### Need to know

- Public Liability Insurance with a \$20m coverage in the aggregate and Professional Indemnity Insurance with \$2m in the aggregate is required under most circumstances. IBA may on an ad hoc basis grant lower levels of liability coverage if a risk assessment confirms low risk for the project.
- Budgets are to be submitted GST exclusive
- The standardised [IBA Confirmation of Descent Form](#) is required for all key management personnel and company directors. Any other form to provide evidence of Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander descent is insufficient.
- An evaluation at the end of the program is critical to assess outcomes and impact. Reporting will require feedback from program participants

Budget	Program partner travel	Participant travel and payments	IBA will assess your application to understand program versus enabling costs. Value for money is assessed by establishing the balance between those costs. Program costs are those that are for the benefit of participants via the program. Enabling costs are business costs. The majority of the budget should be going towards program costs.
